Application guidelines

2026 OWSD-Elsevier Foundation Awards for Early Career Women Scientists in the Developing World

'Sustainable, Affordable, and Reliable Energy'

Applications for the 2026 awards are invited from women scientists who have made significant contributions in the area of **sustainable**, **affordable**, **and reliable energy**, whose research is linked to <u>SDG7 (Affordable and clean energy)</u>, who have received PhDs within the last ten years and who have lived and worked for at least 5 years in an <u>eligible Scientifically and Technologically Lagging Countries (STLCs)</u>.

The deadline for submission of applications is **31 August, 2025**.

Applications must be made online, in English, and must include:

- Official documentation proving 5 years' residency in an eligible STLC. The following documents can be submitted as proof of residence as long as the name of the applicant (as written in the online form) appears clearly: statement from the local police office or municipality, population registry office, rental agreement, utility bills, employment contract. This list is not exhaustive and alternative documents can be considered. Please write to owsd@owsd.net if you are not sure about the eligibility of your documents.
- Evidence on how your research contributes to advancing the <u>SDG7 (Affordable and clean energy)</u>.
- Motivational statement of no more than 2500 characters describing why you should be selected for this award, the excellent quality of your research, greatest achievements of your scientific career, impact of your work locally/regionally/internationally, and where relevant, any persona/professional challenges you have faced and overcome given your context (for ease, we recommend that you prepare this beforehand and copy-paste into the text box).
- PhD certificate
- Curriculum vitae
- Full list of publications
- At least 2 reference letters (reference letters must be prepared on official letterhead and should be written and signed by senior scientists familiar with your research).

If any of the supporting documents are not in English, you must attach an English translation. **Documents in other languages with no accompanying English translation will NOT be considered**.
